

## **WTSI Publication Policy**

### **Information for collaborators**

July 2010

The Wellcome Trust (WT) has been a leading advocate of open and unrestricted access to published research, and has mandated that papers describing research that it funds must be made publicly available through UK PubMed Central (UKPMC) as soon as possible and in any event within 6 months of the journal publisher's official date of final publication. The Wellcome Trust Sanger Institute (WTSI) therefore requires that its researchers apply this policy to any papers in which they are authors or coauthors.

Any such publications should only be submitted to journals that accommodate the WT open access policy (check the Wellcome Trust resource <http://www.wellcome.ac.uk/openaccesslist> or the Sherpa/Romeo database <http://www.sherpa.ac.uk/romeo/> - if unsure, email [openaccess@wellcome.ac.uk](mailto:openaccess@wellcome.ac.uk)). Care must be taken to select the correct WT-compliant open access options at the time of submission for publication. Wherever it exists, the option to pay a fee so that the article is immediately deposited in UKPMC should be selected. In certain journals which would otherwise prohibit submission to UKPMC, acknowledging the WT (as a funder with an open access policy) will enable deposit in UKPMC of the "final author's draft" version of the publication 6 months after the journal publisher's official date of final publication.

The contribution of a WTSI author/coauthor should always be associated with an acknowledgement of WT funding. The format of this acknowledgement should be as follows: "This work was supported by the Wellcome Trust [grant number xxxxxx]". If the research is not associated with a faculty grant number, the WTSI core grant number (079643) should be used.

The funds necessary to meet compliance with the WT policy should be reasonably split between authors.
